Among the ponds and monuments of Warsaw's largest park, Łazienki Royal Park, lies the lovely neo classical Palace on the Water. This tranquil setting plays host to your first taste of Warsaw; an exclusive piano recital of Chopin's exquisite music. Dinner follows in one of the most inviting places on the Polish culinary map; Restaurant Belvedere. Located in the new orangery of the Warsaw Royal Bath Gardens, its sublime cuisine is matched by elegant interiors and welcoming ambience.

○ Welcome to Warsaw

Choice of activity. This morning is yours to:

- **Travel in Time:**

Journey back to the age of communist Poland. Panoramic city tour by vintage “cucumber” bus followed by a tasting of Poland’s most important drink; vodka, in a restaurant typical of communism time.

- **Tour Warsaw in a vintage tram:**

Wooden seated trams are the unusual mode of transport on a route which includes the major attractions and most prestigious streets of the city and a short visit to Praga district. Vodka & Polish snacks served on board.

- **Explore Warsaw’s Old Town:**

Its cobblestoned streets are an excellent example of a compromise between historic values and modern needs - art, galleries, shops, charming restaurants, craftsmen's workshops.

- **Learn about Chopin:**

Get acquainted with the collection of relics of his life and with the headquarters of the Chopin Society.



○ Afternoon - Train transfer to Cracow

This two and a half hour train trip feels even shorter with some surprises on board - tasting of Polish specialties (sausages, pickles & marinades, pastries, fruits, etc.) served in rustic-style panniers.



○ Evening - Pub crawl

Following a tour of Cracow’s highlights, party like Cracovians and explore a world of flavoured vodkas and refreshing beers. There are over 200 inviting pubs in the historical part of the city, many located in medieval cellars. ‘Red Piano’ is one atmospheric venue which recreates the suave and slinky world of yesteryear.

Activities. Today is yours to:

- **Discover the Wawel Castle and Cathedral:**

The most popular and the richest museum in Poland with several thousands of priceless works of art on display.

- **Explore Krakow by segway / golfcart:**

A novel way of seeing the city's highlights including the Old Town, barbican, defense walls and Renaissance Cloth Hall.

- **Embark on a Schindler's List Tour:**

Roam the medieval streets of the former Jewish district of Kazimierz, setting of Spielberg's iconic film, Klezmer music concert.

- **Art Deco Cracow:**

Visit the stained glass studio that has been setting standards in stained glass design art for over a century, then the Franciscan gothic church to see the finest collection of stained glass in situ. Refreshments in the art deco Jama Michalika café.

- **Visit Auschwitz-Birkenau:**

Nazi camp where millions perished 1940-1944.



○ Evening - Palace of the Rams

A stylish fleet of romantic horse and carriages is waiting by the hotel entrance for your leisurely transfer to the Main Market Square. In the southern corner stands Palace Pod Baranami named for the rams decorating its elegant facade. Former home of Poland's greatest aristocratic families, its magnificent Ballroom and legendary cabaret provides a sumptuous setting for your final evening in Poland.

○ Morning - Wieliczka Salt Mine

Over 700 years many generations of Polish miners have worked in this UNESCO listed heritage site. See a number of its excavated chambers over 3 levels, the main one is located 130 meters below ground level. Decorated with stunning statues sculpted in salt, its the oldest operational salt mine in the world. After a guided tour of the mine, toast your time in Poland with a final warming shot of vodka before departure for the airport and onward journey home.
