Over 700 years many generations of Polish miners have worked in this UNESCO listed heritage site. Decorated with stunning statues sculpted in salt, its the oldest operational salt mine in the world. After a guided tour of the mine, toast your time in Poland with a final warming shot of vodka before departure for the airport and onward journey home.













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
