Home to a world famous collection of iconic works of Dutch Art, the Royal Picture Gallery Mauritshuis is yours to enjoy an exclusive dinner. After a short guided tour of the gallery, enjoy a sumptuous gala feast served under the watchful eyes of the old masters Rembrandt, Vermeer and Frans Hals.

○ Morning - Hail The Hague

Seat of Dutch government, The Hague is dotted with historical and royal statues and palaces. This morning, learn all about the rich past of the Dutch royal family with guided visits of the residence of Queen Beatrix; the Huis ten Bosch Palace and the Peace Palace. Linger in the impressive Knight's Hall at the Binnenhof before stopping for lunch in the exclusive Des Indes hotel, a favourite with royalty and world leaders alike.



○ Afternoon - The “Green Heart of Holland”

Next stop is Veluwe, the country's largest nature park or the “Green Heart of Holland” as its more affectionately known. Marvel at the world famous tulip fields during the journey, a riot of colour if your visit is in April or May.



○ Evening - Medieval dinner

Step back in time and dine like lord and ladies at a medieval castle in the heart of Veluwe, your home for the night. A veritable feast typical of a traditional medieval banquet is served while traditional court dancing fuels the regal spirit of the occasion.

○ Morning – Veluwe Rally

Having indulged in a luxurious breakfast buffet in the castle's fairytale gardens, its time for a rally adventure. Jump aboard your Fiat 500 for an exhilarating tour through the lush and tranquil countryside of the Veluwe region, passing wildlife reservation areas, ruins of ancient Roman fortresses and prehistoric tombs.



○ Afternoon – Sail on the 'Zuiderzee'

The rally comes to an end at the Zuizerdee but the adventure continues aboard a fleet of sailing boats. Yes, you are taking to the seas for destination Amsterdam! Follow the Captain's orders carefully as you help to navigate his ship. Hearty lunch served on board.



○ Evening - Destination Amsterdam

Once berthed in Amsterdam, continue to the Grand Hotel Amrâth, a hotel truly steeped in maritime history, and the place from which Cornelius Houtman set out on the first voyage to East India in 1595. Dinner is served in The Seven Seas Restaurant, a shrine to the city's strong maritime influence.

○ Morning – The world of van Gogh

Your day of Dutch culture begins with a private introduction to the eccentric world of van Gogh. A leading art historian is waiting to guide you through the visual genius of his work; technique and composition, influences and muses.



○ Afternoon - Jordaan Quarter & Anne Frank House

Compared to the rest of Amsterdam, this 17th century neighbourhood is an oasis of peace with a labyrinth of narrow streets and little canals, art studios, old-fashioned 'brown' pubs, boutiques and galleries to explore. Lunch at an intimate eatery typical of the area. Continue to The Anne Frank House, probably Amsterdam's most famous house and hide out of the Frank family during the Second World War and setting for her haunting, captivating diary.



○ Evening - Rijksmuseum

Appropriately keeping watch as you dine in the special surrounds of this internationally acclaimed museum is 'Nightwatch', one of Rembrandt's most revered paintings.

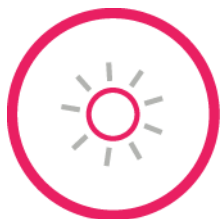
