Evening - Welcome to Montenegro

In culinary terms a visit to Montenegro is a treat which true gourmets will relish. This evening, in a small mountain cottage, your welcoming hosts will serve a typical Montenegrin meal of smoked ham, homemade cheese and kajmak, traditional doughnuts (priganice), kacamak and cicvara. Morning - Water rafting

Prepare to experience an amazing rafting adventure through the world's second deepest canyon. Famed for its superb natural landscape, its little wonder the Canyon of the Tara River is known as the "tear of Europe".



Afternoon - Wine tasting

After a picnic lunch, what better way to refresh the palate than with some wine tasting? In the unusual but highly atmospheric wine cellar setting on a hilltop fortress, sample some of the region's first class wines while the wine master shares some of his secrets.

Arrival in Budva, one of the oldest settlements on the Adriatic coast whose Old Town ramparts date back from the 15th century.



o Evening - Dine by the sea

Steps from the water front, with uninterrupted views of Budva's Old Town and city marina, a restaurant on Budva's esplanade is the setting for a unique dining experience. Delightful food is spiced up with klapa music, a type of a cappella singing celebrating love, wine, homeland and sea.













Historical Montenegro

Visit the Old Royal Capital Cetinje, King Nikola's Palace and the Monastery of St Peter of Cetinje which houses some of the richest treasures of the Christian world including the right hand of St. John the Baptist and a piece of the Holy Cross. In the afternoon, participate in traditional Village Knight's games and sample smoked hams, cheeses and honey wines from Njegusi village.



Evening

This evening is yours to enjoy a spectacular dinner in the impressive edifice of the Old Governmental house dating back from the beginning of the 19th century.













Boka Bay & Kotor

Soak up stunning views of the pretty villages and ornate Renaissance and Baroque palaces dotted along the southernmost fjord in Europe. On the island of Our Lady of the Rock, a champagne and baroque orchestra recital provides a welcome introduction to the medieval town of Kotor whose ancient walls rise 4.5 km directly above the city.



o Evening - Maritime Museum Palace

Perast used to be the town of sailors and after sailing its sapphire blue waters, what better place to dine than in its Maritime Museum? Built in the spirit of Renaissance architecture with an enviable location and elegant interiors, its a welcoming venue for landlubbers and sailors alike.













Skadar Lake

Embark on a leisurely cruise along the rocky shores of the Skadar Lake. Breathe in the sage and rosemary scented air while passing ancient chestnut forests and islets covered with shrubs and pomegranates. Relax over a barbeque fish lunch in picturesque Pjesacac.
