Despite suffering damages from the April 2015 earthquake, Kathmanduretains its hustle and bustle and its people are still as jovial as ever.












o Arrive in Kathmandu

Morning - Sightseeing

Gear up to climb the steep stairs to Swayambhunath Stupa, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This is the most ancient and perhaps the most enigmatic of all holy shrines in Kathmandu offering spectacular views of the city.



Afternoon

Visit Kathmandu Durbar Square consisting of small courtyards and shrines. A UNESCO World Heritage Site, the main highlight is the temple of the living goddess, Kumari.

Take an exciting rickshaw ride through a vibrant alley to the bustling vegetable & spice market of Ason.



Evening

Visit Patan, the city of architectural interior and a paradise of fine arts. Famous for woodcarving and ancient palaces, The UNESCO World Heritage Site, Patan Durbar Square tells a tale of rich history and heritage.









Morning

Head to Boudhanath Stupa, a center of Tibetan Buddhism. The recently renovated stupa is built on a massive three level mandala style platform and is one of the largest in the world. It is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



Afternoon

The magnificent Pashupatinath Temple with its astonishing architectural beauty is situated on the banks of the sacred Bagmati River. This UNESCO World Heritage Site is regarded as the most sacred of all Lord Shiva temples and also a renowned Hindu cremation site.



Evening

Drive to the medieval city of Bhaktapur or Bhadgaon that translates as the 'City of Devotees'. Still untouched by rapid urbanization, Bhaktapur retains its charm by its brick paved roads and red brick houses. Bhaktapur Durbar Square is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and has the best preserved extraordinary temples and palaces from the Malla Dynasty.
